IN MEMORIAM – FRANK FEDERICO



The pastel community is greatly diminished this year by the passing of Frank Federico on July 30, 2018, shortly after his 90th birthday. Frank is known across the country and around the globe for his energy and artistic excellence in many styles and many mediums. He had many credits garnishing his career, including numerous top awards in national competitions, signature status in pastel, oil, watercolor, and acrylic art organizations, and

in 2013 he was the Hall of Fame Honoree for the Pastel Society of America.

Frank Federico was born in New Orleans, Louisiana, on July 3, 1928, and grew up in that area. After serving in the army in Japan post-World War II, he returned to New Orleans where he worked as art director for a department store, then as an illustrator, and eventually as a street artist doing "quickie" pastel portraits. He left New Orleans for New York City, where a First Prize in a watercolor show set him up for a start in his new career. Soon he relocated to Gloucester, MA, where he owned and ran a gallery while painting prolifically in oil, pastel, watercolor, and acrylic. A winter visit to Florida became a long-term move, and he lived, painted, and taught there for a number of years. He was named "Artist of the Year" for Pinellas County (FL) in 1983, as he kept pushing his boundaries into new areas of subject matter, style, and technique. In the late 80's he and his wife Chery relocated to Goshen, CT, near her childhood home and family. From there Frank became involved in many regional and national organizations, particularly the Connecticut Pastel Society. He was an early president of CPS, and his energy and inspiration dramatically increased the participation of pastelists in the New England region. His last attendance as an instructor at IAPS was in 2013.



Frank was renowned as a teacher not only in pastel, but also in oil, watercolor, and acrylic, with trips to various parts of the country teaching workshops and making friends. He was also in great demand as juror and judge for exhibitions, as well as for his famous critique sessions. His reputation as a colorist is firmly established, and for many of us fortunate enough to have seen his demonstrations, the



excitement of the gouache underpaintings over bright cadmium yellow ground still brings a thrill of delight. Also well-known for his work in abstraction, he attracted collectors of various styles of artwork. Though Frank left New Orleans as a fairly young artist, he maintained his love for the jazz music he grew up with. For many years he produced energetic, somewhat abstract acrylic jazz posters for the annual Litchfield CT Jazz Festival, which are still considered collector's items.

Frank loved to paint the natural world and relished the opportunity of a plein-air demonstration for students. He was equally at home, though, with still life, portrait, interiors, and so on, imbuing each with his own blend of energy, color sense, and sensitivity no matter the medium. In his art and in his workshops, he promoted the view that diversity in artwork is a healthy approach and that for the individual's work "uniqueness" of expression is paramount. In the articles he wrote for art publications such as Pastel Journal, he stressed this element of an artist's growth.

We were fortunate to have his influence, for while Frank was a serious artist he was also someone who loved people, loved to laugh, and enjoyed life. The conversation during his demonstrations, for example, was often hilarious at the same time it was serious, with references to artists from history and many a word invented on the spot.

Frank is survived by his wife Chery and by three children, Sharron, Debra and Kevin.

She has been faculty at The Pastel Society of America, Louisiana State University, the University of New Orleans, and Pennsylvania State University. She is the author of the books "Strokes of Genius 6: The Best of Drawing" and "Art Journey: Portraits and Figures, The Best of Contemporary Drawing." The winner of Pastel 100's 2018 Ruth Richeson Gold Award, Carol has exhibited The Butler Institute of American Art; the Salmagundi Club, NYC; the National Arts Club, NYC; and The Ogden Museum, among others. She received her MFA from Penn State University, and her BA from the University of New Orleans.
