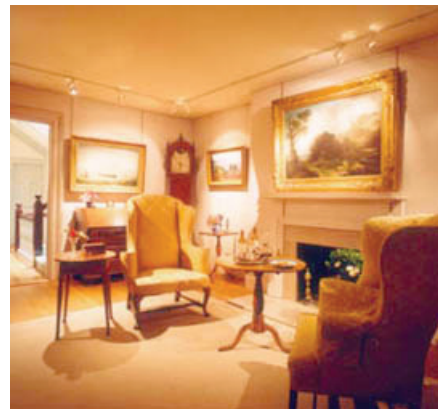
NEW SHOW! The IAPS 24th Juried Exhibition - Spring 2014

Staying on the topic of our exhibitions, I want to give you all an important advance notice. Our 24th IAPS Juried Exhibition will be held next spring in Boston, MA. The first time an IAPS Exhibition has been in New England. It will be held at the nation's oldest gallery, the esteemed Vose Galleries of Boston, on Newbury Street. Vose Gallery was established in 1841 and has been run by members of the same family since the the day it opened. The Vose family is opening their arms to IAPS and is thrilled to be host to the best of the pastel medium.

Which brings me to the next topic. **What to submit?** I am writing now to give you a heads-up so you will have time to paint the best you can with this exhibition as a goal. **We wish to encourage you to submit new work.** Take the next few months to push yourselves, to try something new, to create new paintings with this goal in mind. As you know not every painting can be accepted. But, we need to accept this as part of the process of our growth as an artist. I do find it easier to push myself when I have a goal in mind...so this is that opportunity.

We are still working on specific dates, however the show will open in early May and run through June so that means our call for entries will close on March 1. That's not that far away - so time to get some new materials ordered and start painting! Look for the Call for Entries on January 1, 2014.

The IAPS Website

The new website will be easier to navigate, will have specific Member Society information, and will include the ability for member societies to post their own national workshops directly without needing to send the information to us.

Pat will be moving to our Advisory Council along with two former IAPS Board members, Elizabeth Mowry and Duane Wakeham. IAPS wishes to recognize all three of these artists for their dedicated years of service and support!

Richard McKinley and Paula Ford have been invited to fill out the terms vacated by Elizabeth and Duane. Richard will be working on our Convention Program Planning committee and Paula will continue her excellent work as our Exhibition Chair. Both bring remarkable skills, depth and range of talent and we are very honored to have them join our Board.

The 2015 IAPS Convention

Our 11th Convention will be held in Albuquerque, New Mexico from June 3-7, 2015. The Convention will start with the IAPS PASTELWORLD Reception and Awards on Wednesday, June 3 and will run through Sunday, June 7.

Registration will begin in September 2014. As introduced at the last convention, we will offer a two-week pre-view time so you can plan your convention experience prior to registration opening. The Hotel Albuquerque will not be accepting hotel reservations until closer to registration. We will notify our member societies when you can book the hotel.

2015 IAPS Convention Demonstrators

We are still taking applications for instructors wishing to be considered for the 2015 IAPS Convention program. Our application form and eligibility information can be found and downloaded from the IAPS website at www.pastelinternational.com. Please note that all applications need to be received by December 2, 2013.
